Crochet Towel Dog

I was gifted with some skeins of the new Woolly Hugs yarn FROTTEE by Veronika Hug. It's a thick bouclé type yarn and especially suitable for crocheting bath accessoires like towels, wash clothes or scrubbies. This kind of yarn can be difficult to work with, especially for beginners, so I recommend working with a normal worsted weight yarn first. The FROTTEE is available in 15 colors and I love the wonderful curly texture.









Step 1 - material



Step 2 - crochet

That's what you need:

- 4 skeins of Woolly Hugs FROTTEE à 50 gr. in camel, linen and white
- crochet hook 4 mm
- scissors
- yarn needle
- safety eyes 10 mm
- 2 rubber bands



Step 3 - roll

Using camel yarn, chain 48.

Row 1: 1 sc + 1 dc all in the 2^{nd} chain from hook, *skip one stitch, 1 sc + 1 dc in next stitch*, repeat from * to * across to the last 2 stitches, skip one stitch, sc in last stitch Row 2: ch 1, turn, 1 sc + 1 dc all in first sc, skip the next dc, *1sc + 1 dc in next sc, skip next dc*, repeat from * to * across, sc in last stitch

Row 3-31: repeat row 2 for pattern



Step 4 - fold legs

Fasten off and weave in ends. Roll the rectangle up to opposite ends to meet in the center.

Fold in half and tie with a rubber band leaving 1/3 for the legs and 2/3 for the head/snout.



Step 5 - fold snout

To form the snout, press the upper part down and wrap it with another rubber band.

Ears (2x)

We continue crocheting with linen yarn.

Round 1: 6 sc in magic ring (6)

Round 2: inc, rep 6 times (12)

Round 3: sc 1, inc, rep 6 times (18)

Round 4: sc 2, inc, rep 6 times (24)

Rounds 5-7: sc 24 (24)

Round 8: sc 2, dec, rep 6 times (18)

Round 8: sc 1, dec, rep 6 times (12)

Close with 6 slip stitches and leave long tail

for sewing.

Nose

We use white yarn now.

Round 1: 6 sc in magic ring and close with slip stitch (6)

Fasten off and leave long tail for sewing.

Finishing

Sew nose to the snout, ears to the head and insert safety eyes to the head as shown in the pictures.

Feel free to crochet a tail if you want (3)



And now you're done!
