

# Charley the Chicken

## Material:

- Woolly Hugs Charity, 50 g maize, 50 g petrol, some orange
- 4 mm crochet hook
- scissors and sewing needle
- stuffing material
- 9 mm safety eyes



Work body, arms and legs in back loops only!

## Body (maize)

- R 1: 6 sc in magic ring (6)  
R 2: inc, rep 6 times (12)  
R 3: sc 1, inc, rep 6 times (18)  
R 4: sc 2, inc, rep 6 times (24)  
R 5: sc 3, inc, rep 6 times (30)  
R 6: sc 4, inc, rep 6 times (36)  
R 7: sc 5, inc, rep 6 times (42)  
R 8-15: sc 42 (42)  
Insert safety eyes between R 12 and R 13 with 8 stitches apart.  
R 16: sc 5, dec, rep 6 times (36)  
R 17: sc 4, dec, rep 6 times (30)  
R 18: sc 3, dec, rep 6 times (24)  
R 19: sc 2, dec, rep 6 times (18)  
Stuff firmly.  
R 20: sc 2, inc, rep 6 times (24)  
R 21: sc 3, inc, rep 6 times (30)

- R 22-26: sc 30 (30)  
R 27: sc 3, dec, rep 6 times (24)  
R 28: sc 2, dec, rep 6 times (18)  
Stuff firmly.  
R 29: sc 1, dec, rep 6 times (12)  
R 30: dec, rep 6 times (6)  
Sew the remaining stitches with the needle to close the hole and weave in ends.

## Legs 2x (maize)

- R 1: 4 sc in magic ring (4)  
R 2: inc, rep 4 times (8)  
R 3: sc 1, inc, rep 4 times (12)  
R 4-5: sc 12 (12)  
Stuff firmly (lower part only).  
R 6: sc 1, dec, rep 4 times (8)  
R 7-30: sc 8 (8)  
Leave long tail for sewing.

## Arms 2x (maize)

- R 1: 6 sc in magic ring (6)  
R 2-10: sc 6 (6)  
Don't stuff and leave long tail for sewing.

## Beak (orange)

- R 1: ch 4, slip stitch in 1<sup>st</sup> chain to form a ring.  
R 2: into ring 12 sc and join with slip stitch.  
Fasten off and leave long tail for sewing.

## Sweater (petrol)

- Chain 17 and work in rows.  
R 1-23: half double crochet 16 in back loops only, ch 1, turn  
R 24: half double crochet 16 in back loops only  
Bring row 1 up matching row 24 and slip stitch across.  
Fasten off and weave in ends.

### Finishing

Sew legs and arms to the body and beak to the head as shown in the picture.

For the hair and tail, take one piece of yarn and fold in half, stitch your hook through a stitch at the top of the head and back to the body and pull the loop through. Next, pull the ends through the loop and pull tight. Trim to desired length.



And now you're done!

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
